Schools Plus

The school has registered a fundraising project with Schools Plus to raise funds for our Year 3-6 excursion to Borambola. Schools Plus is an organisation where individuals and businesses can donate funds to schools who are facing disadvantage - with a value below 1000 on the Index of Community Socio-Educational Advantage (ICSEA). Goolgowi PS is eligible for this support. The Federal Government has granted Schools Plus Deductible Gift Recipient (DGR1) status, making donations of \$2 or more to schools via Schools Plus tax-deductible. Schools Plus retains a contribution from each donation to support their work with schools. This contribution - which is 5% for Fundraise Yourself/Donor Choice projects and 7.5% for Smart Giving/auspiced projects - helps School Plus provide a crowdfunding platform including resources and advice to schools about donor relationships. fundraising and plus contributes towards the assessment and evaluation of projects. Standard credit card fees also apply to donations.




