

It is my pleasure to let everyone know that I will continue in my role as Relieving Principal at Goolgowi Public School into Term 1 next year. I look forward to working with the staff, students, parents and carers and school community in leading the school.

Our Year 5 students are busy preparing their speeches and completing their nomination forms in preparation to deliver their speeches in Week 8 for the roles of School Captain. We are looking forward to listening to those speeches and voting for the 2024 school leaders.

Attendance Matters

Our whole school attendance data is currently sitting at 90% for the semester with a slight improvement from Semester I. Goolgowi Public School is above the state average of 86.9% as well as being above the Griffith network of schools' average which is sitting 85.8% attendance for the semester. Our goal is to continually improve and we encourage high rates attendance for all our students.

- 98% Attendance = 4 school days off a year or one day a term
- 96% Attendance = 8 school days off a year or two days a term
- 94% Attendance = 12 school days off a year or three days a term
- 92% Attendance = 16 days of a year or four days a term.

Interested players should bring their boots, shin pads and a water bottle to the Coro Club Oval, 10am Sunday 19 November.




