Yanco Agricultural High School

Enrolments for Yanco Agricultural High School are now managed directly by the school and as such, families apply direct to the school, not through the selective schools' process. Students are also no longer required to sit the selective schools test, and the school manages all applications directly. Please see the attached a flyer for further information.

Pool Party and Last Day

The last day of the school year we are celebrating with our annual POOL PARTY. We are asking parents to supply some cakes or slices for the students to have for recess, as requested by them. They can be sent to the school the morning of the pool party. Recess, lunch, snacks and drinks will be provided for all the students on the day.

At the end of the last day of the year (Wednesday 18 December) at around 2:50pm we invite all parents to farewell our

Year 6 students. The Year 6 students will walk through a guard of honour created by the students in K-5 and ring the old bell. Year 6 parents please do not forget your cameras and tissues, especially for those families who are leaving the school.

Presentation Night

We are very much looking forward to our annual Presentation Night assembly where we celebrate the successes of all our students. The 2025 School Captains will be announced, and all the students have been busy practising for their class performances. We invite and welcome the Goolgowi community to attend the night which is held at Goolgowi Community Hall. Presentation Night starts at 6:30 pm and we ask for the audience to be seated prior to this time.

Selective schools

There have been changes to the application and placement process for both selective high schools (SHS) and opportunity classes (OC), students, parents and carers. Tests will mostly be hosted in external centres and conducted on computers delivering a more engaging experience for students. There is also a longer application period for parents and carers to apply.

The application period for both OC and SHS is now the same and will run from 7 November 2024 to 21 February 2025. Due to the longer application period, late applications won't be accepted. With the new application period, parents and carers can now apply for OC placement when their child is at the end of Year 3 or at the start of Year 4, and for SHS placement at the end of Year 5 or at the start of Year 6.

The 2025 test dates are from 2 to 4 May 2025. Students will need to attend one test date only. Further information can be found using the following link:

Attendance

Our attendance rates continue to be an area of focus. We carefully monitor attendance and encourage high attendance rates for all students. At the end of the year, we celebrate students who are above 95% in their attendance as well as our positive attendance data for the year. On average our school had an attendance rate of 92.3% which 5.4% above the state average and 76.7% of students attending more than 90% of the time which is 25.2 % above the state average. Swimming costume, swim shirt, hat, sunscreen, towel, goggles and a water bottle. Thongs/slides may be worn to and from the pool.


All students are expected to participate in the swimming lessons.



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
