For this term, our attendance data show that we have a 95% attendance rate which is above the State average, above the Griffith network of schools and above schools with a similar setting. The data also shows we have 86% of students attending 90% of the time. We encourage and support high levels of attendance to ensure that students have success at school, that they are making valuable connections with others, developing friendships, and are consistently

learning. All staff at Goolgowi Public School work collaboratively to ensure the school is a place where students want to be.





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
